


NYS EARLY LEARNING FRAMEWORK: AVAILABLE RESOURCES

The NYS Early Learning Guidelines and the Core Body of Knowledge: NYS's Core Competencies for Early Childhood Educators make up the Early Learning Framework – the core elements of *New York Works for Children*, the state's early childhood workforce system.

Every licensed early childhood program receives one copy each of the two publications, as do faculty teaching early childhood courses at two-year, four-year, and graduate-level colleges and universities. These foundational publications are designed to support the professional development of all early childhood educators, including school district administrators, program directors, higher education faculty, teachers, providers, and students.



Revised Early Learning Guidelines

The revised New York State Early Learning Guidelines are a child development resource for all early childhood educators working with children from birth through age eight. The Guidelines provide information about developmental milestones, specific instructional, environmental and family engagement supports to use to support young children's development. The Guidelines are designed to use with the New York State Core Body of Knowledge: Core Competencies for Early Childhood Educators as a daily resource and reflection tool.
